



All of your Harvest offerings will be gratefully received by St Paul's Foodbank, although this year it is specifically appealing for powdered milk, pasta sauces, tinned fruit and puddings, porridge and cereals, biscuits, tinned meat, fish and vegetables, long life fruit

juice, tea, coffee and sugar. The one commodity that the Foodbank is desperate for is cooking oil, something that probably doesn't occur to most of us as being needed, but obvious when you think about it! The Foodbank also welcomes baby products such as disposable nappies and baby wipes.

Since our 2014 Harvest collection, we have maintained links with St Paul's Foodbank. We have a collection point just inside our main front door and many members of our congregation pop something into it when they come to church on Sundays.





Suburban Harvest Written by Derek Winterburn

There is something vaguely odd about celebrating a harvest festival when we depend more on the supermarket for our food than a field. I imagine that in an agricultural context bringing in the annual crop is a great achievement worthy of celebration, and it would also be appropriate to recognise in church that after all the hard work of farming it is still true that 'God gives the growth.'

But what about us in Hampton – why should we celebrate a 'Harvest'? May I suggest two reasons, taken from Paul's first letter to Timothy?

Firstly it's a great opportunity to recognise all the food (and drink) that we have available even at the smallest convenience store, and marvel at how much we have to choose from and how many people have been involved in bringing it to us. Even the simplest foodstuffs have come a long way, e.g. both the rice and the canned pineapple in our cupboard comes from Thailand. We expect these things to be available to us, but we should realise that they are not ours by right. Paul says 'As for those who are rich, command them

not to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.' Harvest is an opportunity to say 'thank you' to all who bring our food to us, and to God.

Secondly we can consider those who are less fortunate than ourselves. Just now the news is full of terrible stories of refugees and asylum seekers; millions of people are being sustained by emergency aid. But of course nearly half the world's population lives on less than \$2.50 a day. For ten years St Mary's has been linked with churches in Mozambique; as usual our harvest cash collection goes towards the sponsorship of children and young people (70 this year). Sadly we all know that hardship is also an experience closer to home. So as well as helping those overseas our food collection will be taken to the Foodbank at St Paul's, West Hounslow. As we celebrate harvest we remember Paul's words: 'Be generous, and ready to share.'

Harvest is a time to remember to give thanks and a time to remember others. We would love it if you would join us!

The Seeds are Multiplying! Written by Derek Winterburn

It was ten years ago that the first group of Hamptonians went to Mandimba in Mozambique to initiate a link with the parish of São Paolo. Since then there have been nine further visits and we have sent well over £35,000

to support various projects, as requested by the local church, and agreed by the Bishop of Niassa. In 2006 we launched the Good Seeds scheme which aims to ensure that young people do not drop out of school for lack of money. In Mozambique there is a small charge for secondary education; this is on the principle that people appreciate something that they pay for. However there are many teenagers who have lost both their parents, and either live with another

family member or even by themselves. Finding the money for fees, a uniform and stationery can be too much, especially if they could be earning or looking after children. In a society where almost no-one will go to university, completing secondary education is absolutely life-changing.



Ana is 17 and is in Year 9 (the years are repeated until the pupil passes the grade exam). She lives with her grandfather. Before she received school equipment from Good Seeds, she was so worried that she slept badly. She was very worried that she would have to leave school. But now she can finish her studies.

St Mary's provides a modest amount for each Good Seed but it is enough to keep them in school. But while we offer financial support, the church in Mandimba plays

its part; each young person is mentored by a church member. As the local capacity has grown, the number we can offer to support has risen to 70.

In 2015, in partnership with St Mary's Hampton Primary School, the scheme has been extended to a Mozambican primary school. Although primary education is entirely free, there are still orphans who need help with uniform, stationery and a rucksack. At present there are 30 children who are Primary Good Seeds.





Drama Group News Written by Jean Wood


s we nudge into autumn the pace

'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.'

s the hours of daylight shorten at this time of year, maybe your thoughts are cast forward to the Christmas season. Before that, in the Church's year, comes the season of Advent. This year, as a departure from recent practice, our choir will be leading us in an Advent Carol Service at 6pm on the first Sunday in Advent (29 November). This is in addition to the normal Christmas Carol Service on 20 December.

'Advent' means 'coming' and is traditionally a period of both penitence and joyful celebration. The comings to which we look forward in Advent are both Jesus' coming as the 'light of the world' at the first Christmas and his future coming: Jesus talks of his second coming 'on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory' (Matthew 24: 30). These words are picked up in the ancient Advent Responsory (set to plainsong music by Palestrina):

I look from afar: and lo, I see the power of God coming, and a cloud covering the whole earth.

Go ye out to meet him and say:

Tell us art thou he that should come to reign over thy people Israel?

Our Advent Carol Service will begin with a candlelight procession, inviting us to reflect on, and to celebrate the light that came into the world, bringing a glimmer of divine hope into what we know is all too often a very dark world. As the light of a single candle extends to other candles throughout the church, we are invited to sing: Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel. 'Emmanuel' means 'God with us' and we pray that God will inhabit his world wide church today and rejoice that since Jesus first came, this prophecy has been and still is a modern reality.

We have the opportunity to ponder the significance of Jesus coming into the world 2000 years ago, saying that: 'The time has come. The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news!' (Mark: 1:15). But we can also ponder the impact of the light of the good news being in our world today; and the impact of him coming again at the end of time. We can wonder at God's love that he should enter our human condition, with all its darkness: 'For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.' (Romans 8:38,39)

So there will be some big themes to consider at our Advent Carol Service, but there will also be that wonder of a candlelight procession and the joy of singing, and listening as the choir sings, some beautiful Advent Carols: O come, O come Emmanuel; Zion hears the Watchmen's voices; Lo, how a Rose e'er blooming; Lo, he comes with clouds descending.

I hope that this opportunity to celebrate the King who brings light into the world will begin the Advent season for us all in a rather special way. Do come and join us.

Invitation to children over eight to try out St Mary's Hampton Parish Choir – maybe with their Dads!

ampton Parish choir has a long choral tradition. Training to sing in our robed four part choir can be great fun as well as offering boys and girls musical training and the chance to learn team work, to make friends and to build confidence. We aim to sing in the best English Parish Church tradition, without being stuffy about it, as we lead the church in praising God at the sung Eucharist at 9.30am each Sunday morning.

We are keen to expand the number of junior choristers (aged 8 and above) and are holding an Open Day 10-11.30am on Saturday 17 October at St Mary's Church.

The Open Day is designed to give a taster of what happens at choir practice, begin to see how it works to read music and turn it into singing, and the chance to sing in teams or even individually. (There is no need to prepare anything.) You will meet some of the existing members and hear about what is involved in being a chorister. Parents are welcome to stay and enjoy coffee and a bun while their children sing.

Our regular singing each Sunday morning is mostly 'classical' choral music, hymns, psalms and service settings. Additional major items each year include a traditional, candlelit carol service, a Passion for Holy Week and occasional full Choral Evensongs. Choir practices are currently 7.45 to 9pm each Friday at the church but if we have enough junior choristers, they will meet 7-8.30pm. We should also be pleased to welcome dads to sing with their children to expand the number of Tenors and Basses. See separate course 'Choir singing for men' on page 20.

The structured coaching leads to the recognised Royal School of Church Music accredited medals. St Mary's takes the safety of children and young people very seriously. The choir follows the church's safeguarding policy, and all leaders are DBS-checked. Junior choristers will be paid $\pounds I - \pounds 2$ for each service and separate rehearsal (ie up to about $\pounds 26 - \pounds 52$ per quarter), depending on progress with the RSCM training and levels of attendance.



School's out for Summer - Kids, welcome to the world of work! Written by Nick Neilan

aunched at the start of the summer term, eleven of our teenagers have been put through their paces as part of our six month Preparation for Work Programme. Funded by a £5,000 grant from the Garfield Weston Foundation, the young people attended weekly sessions which taught them what employers are looking for as well as fundamental work skills that will give them a head start in their future employment. Topics included first impressions, communication, problem solving, customer service, teamwork and time management as well as a leadership session at White Spider climbing centre. We were also extremely pleased to partner with local organisations who ran additional sessions on relationships, first aid and money management, the latter of which was led by Lorraine Davey on behalf of Lloyds Bank, Hampton (Lorraine actually donated her wage to MTV Youth as part of the privilege of running the session!).

All our teens made a big effort in these sessions and showed significant improvement in their expertise as the weeks went by. We were also pleased that three of the young people were able to take part in interviewing the candidates for the YMCA's Director of Children, Youth and Families Work. We have been told that they were a credit to the youth club, receiving high praise from the interviewing panel of YMCA management who were impressed with their involvement, questioning and discernment as well as their fantastic teamwork.

During the summer holidays the work programme has continued. As well as receiving one to one mentoring, the young people have been undertaking work experience placements which have been arranged with a local business or organisation. We have been absolutely thrilled with the feedback we have received about the young people from their placements and we are now looking forward to celebrating their achievements and reinforcing what they have learned



Views of Hampton

Several stunning aerial views of St Marys have been taken by advertising photographer Paul Campbell, who specialises in aerial photography. They were taken on two separate shoots, the first on a glorious afternoon in early June and the second on a morning at the beginning of August. The time of the day for the photography was carefully planned to ensure the two main aspects of the church, the bell tower and the nave, were perfectly lit by the direction of the sun.



They were taken from an AS355 twin engine helicopter at 750 feet, the lowest height permitted by the Civil Aviation Authority. Helicopter flying is horrifyingly expensive and the aerial visits to Hampton were only made financially possible by diverting

the aircraft during shoots over Central London. The photographer used a Canon EOS 5D camera with gyro stabiliser mounts to eliminate vibration and ensure perfect clarity and sharpness.






