



If you try and contact the vicar every now and then you will be told that he is on a course. This often means that I am away training and improving my skills. Listening to experts on how to run a church, school or charity more effectively or keeping up to date with the latest safety procedures.

However sometimes when you are told that I am on a course, it is a different type of course entirely. It might not be the instructive, educational type of course but rather a course with green rolling hills, pockets of sand and little white balls flying around. Sometimes the course that I am on is a golf course.

The most restorative thing I have found to do, the thing that most washes way the stresses of the moment, is to spend some time with old friends or new acquaintances enjoying a round of golf.

TIME

Time is the most limited of our resources. It does not matter how successful you are, how many people are influenced by you, the money or supplies you have, your time will always be limited. Time is also constantly creeping past us. No amount of effort can pause or reverse it.

A rabbi calls time the most sarcastic force in the universe: 'a slick treacherous monster with a jaw like a furnace incinerating every moment of our lives.' It is a never-ending entropic force which engulf us.

The surprising thing in the Bible is that the very first thing that God declares to be Holy, Holiness being something that is set apart to be special for God, is not a building or place. It is not a person or a priest, but rather a day. The first thing that God makes Holy is the sabbath - a time to rest and stop.

REST

The fact that one of the very first things mentioned in the Bible is for us, following the example of God, to not do anything for a portion of the week jars with a world that calls us to constantly do more.

However it is not entirely surprising. We can so often be consumed by what we are doing that the Biblical call to stop and pause is a reminder to remember the core of who we are. We are called to be, rather than to do. We are called to find our primary identity is what we love, what we find joy in before we go out and plough ourselves into working for those things. If we work first we become defined by our activity not by our love.

We see this in the life of Jesus who leads an incredibly busy three years of ministry. Thousands starting to follow him, dozens upon dozens healed, a movement started that shook the Roman Empire in a period of time that most of our strategic planning would consider a blink in time. Yet again and again we see examples of him withdrawing, praying, pausing and resting.

In stopping and pausing I cannot rest behind the lie that I can bury the scars and hurts of my heart beneath my activity. In a time of rest I have to face up to me; the good parts and the bad. I'm reminded of my true role in my life. That the world continues to revolve, that things move forward whether I invest energy into them or go and play a round of golf. The salvation of this world is not dependent on my effort but rather Him who I follow.

So this summer; as holidays are booked in, fetes attended, barbecues with friends enjoyed; let us not just do those things from a place of indulgence but knowing our souls are being restored by pausing and resting.





BELL RINGING AT ST MARY'S

If you live near St Mary's you will have heard the church bells calling parishioners to the Sunday 9:30 service. This old tradition of change ringing is a speciality of the UK and there are over 5000 towers with bells hung for ringing. Whilst the bells in different towers vary in number and weight, the principle of ringing is the same everywhere and once you have learnt to ring, you can practise the art in any location where there is a band of ringers.

We have a renewed bell ringing activity at St Mary's with a regular practice night on Wednesdays from 8pm to 9pm. We would welcome new ringers to our band, no previous experience is necessary. We are now training complete beginners, any age from about 12 upwards. It is not a strenuous activity – just a normal level of physical fitness is required.

Our eight bells are original to the present church building and will soon be 200 years old. As part of our ringing development we are working towards an overhaul of the bell mechanisms and a refurbishment of the ringing chamber. This is a substantial project and we will be embarking on fundraising soon, more to follow in the Harvest edition of The Parish Link. 

News from Mandimba

Our partner parish of Sao Paolo's Mandimba is part of a growing Christian community and now has five outlying congregations, all looked after by Padre Austen. Each congregation has a catechist – a leader who has some training, but is not ordained and therefore cannot take services such as Holy Communion. For this, they need a visit from Padre Austen.

These congregations are between 18 to 90 km from Mandimba, but the distance is not the only challenge in visiting them. During our visit last October, we were able to experience for ourselves how difficult travel can be. The local roads are mostly dirt tracks – bumpy and dusty in the dry season, muddy and/or inaccessible during the wet season. There is no form of public transport to the remote congregations, which are most easily accessed by a motorcycle. Up until now, Padre Austen has been dependent upon the goodwill of others in the local community who may be travelling to those areas or willing to lend him transport.



When we met the congregation at St Anna's, Mongola (31 miles from Mandimba; a journey which took 1.5 hours on roads and tracks, followed by a walk and then a 40 minute boat ride across the lake) they said how much they wished Padre Austen could visit more than four times a year.

In previous years, we have also visited the congregations at Mitende, Messangulo and – after a number of unsuccessful attempts – Marcos 18, the most remote congregation.

So, we have purchased a motorcycle which should significantly help Padre Austen to visit and minister to these congregations. During a special service at Sao Paolo's when 16 members were baptized, Bishop Vicente also blessed the new motorcycle – and Padre Austen tried it out! Thank you to all those who have supported this purchase.

Greece in St Paul's Steps

Very early, on a Monday morning in May, a group of 25 pilgrims set off from Gatwick airport to fly to Thessaloniki, Greece, to start a pilgrimage following the footsteps of Paul's secondary missionary journey.

Our first destination was Kevala, formerly known as Neapolis, where Paul landed in Greece travelling from Troas in Asia Minor. This was Paul's first landing in Europe. Kevala is a seaport about 150km east of Thessaloniki, and outside one of the main churches in Kevala is a beautiful mosaic illustrating Paul's arrival.


From Kevala we were able to visit the site where Paul baptised Lydia, a dealer in purple cloth, who was the first European to be baptised. The site includes a fairly modern small Greek Orthodox church, or basilica. Dodging showers, we celebrated communion in the grounds and were able to renew our baptismal vows by the stream where Lydia was baptised.



Travelling a little further north we visited the remains of the old city of Philippi, which was re-established as a Roman colony by Julius Caesar. It was here that Paul and his companion Silas, were thrown into prison after Paul had healed a slave-girl who had been making money for her owners by fortune-telling. The archaeological site is very extensive and we were able visit the Agora, or market-place where Paul would have been put on trial and see a cell similar to the one in which he and Silas would have been imprisoned.

Our next stop was Thessaloniki, the second largest city in Greece with a huge university, the Aristotle University, which in 2014 had about 40,000 students. Our first stop was the acropolis, the highest point of

the city where we had a wonderful panoramic view right down to the waterfront. We were then able to visit the cathedral of Saint Demetrios dedicated to the patron saint of Thessaloniki. We were indebted to an amazing coach driver, who managed to manoeuvre our coach through the narrowest of streets lined with parked cars, without touching anything!



From Thessaloniki Paul travelled to Beroea, but we made a detour so that we could visit the monasteries of Meteora. The Meteora is a rock formation hosting one of the largest and most precipitously built complexes of Eastern Orthodox monasteries. The six monasteries are built on immense natural pillars and hill-like rounded boulders that dominate the local area. In the past the monks were winched up to the monasteries in nets; thankfully there is now a very bendy road so we could drive there. Each monastery has its own church containing a rich selection of icons.

Continuing south we visited Delphi, a town on Mount Parnassus in the south of mainland Greece. It is the site of the 4th Century BC Temple of Apollo, once home to a legendary oracle. I had not realised how mountainous Greece is, there was still snow visible on some of the mountain tops, whilst we basked in warm sun at lower levels. Whilst in Delphi, the sky darkened and we watched a storm blow in across the valley, accompanied by thunder and forked lightning, luckily the worst of the storm passed us by.

Next stop was Athens, which Paul and Silas reached by boat. Athens is full of archaeological remains. From the Aeropagus on Ares Hill next to the Parthenon, there is wonderful view of the city. Here



Paul and Silas spoke to the Athenians about his God who made the world and everything in it, and some of the crowd became believers. There are so many archaeological sites in Athens that even when visiting restaurants, it is not unusual for the remains of something to be clearly visible.


Our final day was spent in Corinth, now separated from the mainland by the Corinth Canal. We were able to stop and take photographs of the canal from the bridge. It is an amazing engineering feat but not good if you do not like heights. Paul visited Corinth at least three times. The city existed in Ancient Greece, but was destroyed by the Romans around 146 and re-established by Julius Caesar in 44 BC.

We concluded our pilgrimage with a celebration of communion in the ancient city of Corinth. We were a mixed group of Christians from several Anglican churches as well as a Methodist Minister and two Salvation Army officers. It was very special to share Christ's meal with all these people who we had grown to know over the week, and to sing "How Great Thou Art" as a final climax.

Thank you to the Revds Derek Winterburn and David Uffindell for their leadership and shepherding of our group and to Evie our Greek guide whose knowledge was encyclopaedic and English amazing and who looked after us expertly. We will all have many wonderful memories of our Greek adventure.
