

Going Somewhere?

t was ten years ago yesterday, on top of the Duomo cathedral in the centre of Florence, that I asked my wife to marry me. In the past decade things have changed. We've gone through many things in life. We've seen two daughters born, we've had friends and relatives pass away.

We've had times where the blessings and plans of God are apparent and clear. We've had times when life is messy, when we are not sure where God is. And we now come to a new stage as we move to Hampton and I become vicar of St Mary's.

This next stage of our journey feels clear and certain. It's exciting and we feel a sense of calling to Hampton and St Mary's. However there have been times where we've not known what is next. Normally we've had a sense of what the next step might be, but not where the path will finally lead. I didn't set out to be a vicar when I started working for the church, but I've followed each step and joyfully find myself here.

Throughout the Bible we see God's people being called on a journey. God calls Abraham to leave his home, the Israelites escape slavery for a 40 year journey through the wilderness, Jesus always seems to be on the move, Paul travels Europe telling of the Good News.

We can see the world in two ways. We might see a perfect life as something that is finely formed. We aspire for that moment where everything is unbroken, without blemish and flawless. Like a fine statue; everything in its place and no messy problems. Alternatively we can see life as something that grows. Every day different, sometimes in need of a prune and sometimes growing furiously. Where success or failure is less about where we are now and more about where we are going.

Where are you going?

A question that is not meant to be accusatory, rather an invitation. An invite to take the next step that is in front of you. To step out and do something that you've delayed.


Jesus promises to be a light unto our feet. He promises to guide our next step. We might want a road map to the final destination, but the promise of Jesus is an invitation into a new life which is different from the one you have now. It requires movement. It requires a step out in faith. Standing still means that we never get to where we are led.

I do know that with God at the heart of it and with the courage for us to continue to keep taking another step we will see more of what God has in store for us.

One thing that I do know is that God has guided me and my family. I invite you to join us on this great adventure with God – allowing him to show you and me the next step.

Memories of Summer Fêtes past

The third Saturday in June has been 'Fête Day' at St Mary's for well over 50 years. The fete used to be held in the grounds of 'Beveree', which in those days was a home run by Ealing Council. The fête moved to the Churchyard around 1990 before Twickenham Prep School moved to the Beveree site in 1992.

Preparations for the fête always started in good time. Several stallholders held open days in their own homes to collect items for their stalls and these were great community occasions. Coffee, lunches and teas were available. Audrey Richardson, late of Ormond Crescent, ran the 'nearly new' clothing stall extremely professionally and I can remember going through rails of clothing in her garden at a pre-fête event. Joan Chapman ran the grocery stall and she also held a magnificent pre-fête event and collected a huge quantity of produce for her stall. Pat Lewis and Esme Philips held a very tasty 'afternoon tea' event for the toiletries stall — an event which is still happening.

In the week leading up to the fête, a huge marquee was erected in the grounds of Beveree. This was essential if it


rained, but amazingly the only really wet Beveree fête I can remember was in 1976, the drought year when more or less the last rain of the summer fell on fête day. As many stalls as possible crammed into the marquee and it was still a very successful event.





On the Thursday evening, a lorry was packed with all the fête paraphernalia from the church hall and taken down to Beveree. Overnight some of this was stored in the marquee and on Friday a small team erected the 'Happy Home' and 'Coconut Shy'. This often meant taking a day's holiday from work! Then there was still a lot to do on Saturday morning ready for fête opening at 2pm.

I started helping at the fête sometime in the 1960s, washingup for the 'tea tent' in an old metal bath. In those days we used china cups, saucers and plates so there was always plenty of washing up to do. Later I ran a sweet stall and rapidly learnt how to make fudge and coconut ice, as well as organising a 'Bunty Pulls the String' attraction for the children. The idea was to pull a string which had some sort of sweet attached to it, the prize might be large or small, but everyone got something. The biggest problem was that the strings all became tangled and constantly needed sorting out!



Clearing up after the fête meant packing up the lorry again to take the equipment back to the church hall. This was done very efficiently but it was still quite late before we could finally put our feet up.

Then, as now, St Mary's Summer

Fête was very much a community event. There were always plenty of chairs and benches where people could sit for a chat and just watch what was going on around them. Of course in those days we did not have the advantage of being able to open the church for visitors during the fête. So please come along this year on 17 June from 12 noon and see how much the fête has changed over the years.

The large marquee was also home to flower arranging competitions with classes for adults and children, local artwork might be displayed, and we had cookery competitions.

There was usually a 'main arena' attraction which included The Havering Girl Pipers, a steel band, Robbo

SMDG production of Black Chiffon

Black Chiffon was written and originally produced in 1949 as a vehicle for Flora Robson. It is definitely of its time, highly traditional and the first question that entered my head when I saw that St Mary's Drama Group was to present the play in the round was 'how will it work?'

I'm pleased to say that I needn't have worried. Jean Wood's blocking was spot on — none of the characters ever masked anyone else and it was never obvious that backs were turned to the audience. The set, too was excellent — and a lesson to anyone who thinks that 'detail' has to mean over-crowding. Just enough furniture and props to give the impression of upper middle class comfort in the days when lunch was often a paste sandwich followed by a tinned peach but there was always a plentiful supply of spirits for a pre and post prandial cocktail.

The play opens with the 'young set' of the cast – bride to be Louise (Katie Rainbow), and her future sister in law, Thea (Catherine de Roure). Both actresses could have stepped straight off an Agatha Christie movie set – perfect accents, hairdos and costumes, but sadly they were perhaps a little too laid back and certainly did nothing at this early stage to allay the fear that the piece itself was going to be too dated for a modern audience. Admittedly they were not gifted with terribly interesting lines and their main raison d'etre seemed purely to be to set the scene, which is a pretty thankless task. James Henry completed the trio of 'youngsters' as Roy, the son of the house and soon to be bridegroom.

estling on the River Thames in Hampton is a small, picturesque pleasure garden hiding a tiny treasure, Garrick's Temple, built by David Garrick in the 18th Century to celebrate the talents of William Shakespeare. This delightful little building was a fitting venue for Keith Wait's latest drama documentary, Dashing Dalby and his Bountiful Daughter, in which he drew heavily from social history, meticulously researched material of people closely associated with Hampton, and St Mary's Parish Church and its Church Yard, situated just a few hundred feet away from Garrick's beautiful folly. Indeed, the main inspiration for his story may be said to be the 'funny tomb' of Three Men in a Boat fame, which turns out to be the tomb, positioned on the east wall at the end of the south aisle of St Mary's Church, of Susanna Thomas and her mother, Lady Dorothy.
